

April 21: Summit rallies past Colts 12-9

Summit's late rally trumped an impressive comeback by the Colts, handing Arlington their fourth consecutive loss in a sloppy game (the two teams combined for 13 errors, with the Colts getting the lion's share). Summit used three hits, two walks, and two infield errors to grab an early 4-0 lead off Colts starter Lawrence Brandt. The score remained that way until the fourth, as Lawrence settled down retiring nine of eleven at one point, with two Jaguars reaching on outfield errors. The Colts bats were silent for the first three innings, with only Lawrence's single to left in the third momentarily rousing the Colts faithful. In the fourth, Austin McKinney started the Colts comeback with a walk, Kelsie Dancer followed with a double, and Daniil Lysenco (DH) singled in two runs. After an error and a fielder's choice, Lawrence got the second of his three hits, a two run single that equalized the score. The Jaguars re-acquired the lead with another unearned run in the 4th. In the top of the 5th, Austin tripled, scoring on a scalded liner off the center fielder's glove by Kelsie. The Colts then grabbed the lead when a popup fell in between the shortstop and third baseman. Unfortunately there was an inning left to play, and reliever Omar Frias could not hold the lead, as several walks, hits, and errors keyed a Summit 7 run rally in the 5th. Down 12-7, the Colts battled to the end, as Kelsie and Jordan Miller got hits, and subs Garrett Burk, Nathan Rowe, and on-base machine Jake Landrith got on base, bringing the tying run to the plate, before a double play grounder ended the game.
