

Colts Rally Past Sam Houston 12-7

SH April 16, 2010. The Arlington Colts JV team defeated Sam Houston 12-7. Leadoff hitter Nathan Rowe opened the game with a single and left fielder Jeff Queary tripled as the new look Colts jumped out to a 6-0 lead.
