

Colts Bash Bowie 11-1

AHS March 29, 2010. The Arlington Colts JV team run-ruled Bowie 11-1, pounding out 14 hits and committing no errors in a dominating victory. Omar Frias, the starting pitcher escaped an early jam in the top of the first, and the Colts seized the lead in the bottom of the first as Tyler Rice had the first Colts triple of the season plating on-base machine Eddie Lozano. Rice scored on a Matt Juarez sacrifice fly, and after a walk to new first baseman/pitcher Sean Moore (now appearing on Monday's with the JV), right-fielder Jeff Queary doubled to put the Colts up 3-0. In the bottom of the third Lozano's double keyed a two-out two-run rally to extend the Colts margin to 5-0. Bowie staged a two-out mini-rally in the top of the third, using a walk and three singles to get on the board. In the top of the fourth with the score still 5-1, Sean Moore took the mound, and that was it for Bowie: he gave up a walk in the fourth and proceeded to strike out the side in the fifth and sixth, finishing off the save with 3 innings of no-hit seven strikeout relief. The Colts hitters didn't know that they could afford to stop scoring and had several big hits with Adam Noonkester (who took over first when Moore went to the mound) going 2-2 with an RBI double, and Queary who was 3-3 with a walk and four RBI's getting the big blows. Entering the bottom of the 6th with a 10-1 lead, Lawrence Brandt singled and later scored the walk off run on Austin McKinney's second hit in as many at-bats. The victory improved the Colts record to 10 and 5, with a 3-1 district record.
